### Intro to HPA

- Peer advisors
  - All are current UCD students
  - <u>Can advise on</u>:
    - Pre-reqs
    - Timelines
    - Experiences
    - LORs
    - Gap-year plans
- Serves all UCD students + alumni
  - Can still use HPA services after graduation (just need student ID)
- Services
  - Mock interviews in Fall
  - Test preps
  - Other workshops/events
    - Each advisor hosts 2 workshops throughout quarter
  - Express & zoom drop-ins advising
    - Zoom drop-ins
      - All questions + topics welcome on a first-come first-serve basis for 15 minute one-on-one session
      - Join early to spend less time in waiting room
      - Many advisors will go over time (more than 15 minutes)
    - Appointments tend to get booked so check every morning

### • Pre-Health Conference

- November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 (Saturday)
- Pre-health exhibitors fair
  - 200+ exhibitions from health professional schools, post-bac programs, test prep companies, other orgs

# What is a Pharmacist / What do they Do

- Dispenses prescription medications + provides patients with info about drugs/usages
- What do they do?
  - Educate patients about prescriptions + OTC medications
  - Provide expertise on drug composition + usage
  - More info can be found here
- Careers
  - Community practice
  - Drug development
  - Hospital pharmacy
  - Consultant pharmacy
    - Provides expertise on drug usage for individuals

## Timeline to Becoming a Pharmacists

- 1. Obtain a bachelor's degree (in any major)
  - Major doesn't have to be chemistry/pharmacy related
- 2. Complete pre-reqs/experiences
- 3. Apply to pharmacy school
- 4. Attend pharmacy school + receive license
  - Optional 2-year residency in between for more experience

## **Pharmacy School Prerequisites**

- Most schools require:
  - Chemistry
  - Biology
  - Organic chemistry
  - Physics
  - Statistics
  - Calculus
  - Economics

- Public speaking
- Some schools require:
  - Human anatomy
  - Human physiology
  - Biochemistry
  - Microbiology
  - Psychology
  - $\circ$  Sociology
  - English composition
- Link to pharmacy school prerequisite chart
- Can choose ANY major to apply to pharmacy school as long as you complete all pre-reqs
  - Choose a major that you truly enjoy!
- Some schools accept AP credit + some schools don't so check before

- Make sure that AP credit shows up on transcript
- Make sure you complete a whole series at ONE college only
  - EX: complete BIS series at UC Davis or CHE series at a community college

# Gaining Experiences

## • Experiences at UCD

- Health related internships through ICC (Internship Career Center)
  - Get a passtime + register for internships (like for classes)
- Undergrad research center
  - Opportunities to publish + present research
- Emergency medicine research associate program (EMRAP)
- Global health internships through study abroad programs
- Volunteering for UCD Pre-Health Conference
- Completing community service using ICC Community Service Database
- Join Pre-Health related club or other student orgs through Center for Student Involvement
  - Join the Pre-Pharmacy Club!
- Volunteer at a student run clinic

## • Experiences outside of UCD

- Not required but many students work at pharmacy before applying
  - Pharmacy technician
  - Working in a pharmacy (any role)
    - EX: pharmacy cashier
  - Shadowing a pharmacist
- Informational interview with a pharmacist
  - Send cold emails to a pharmacist
  - Sit one-on-one with pharmacist and ask questions
- Research
  - Explore faculty pages
  - Cold email professors
    - Talk about your interest + ask how you can get involved
- Make sure you choose experiences that excite you and can write/talk about
- Start making a list of your experiences right now!
  - What you gained from it
  - What you did
  - How many hours you committed to it per week
  - Template can be found on website under Application Prep > Experiences

# **Pharmacy Technician**

- What do pharm techs do?
  - Works under supervision of pharmacist
  - Assists with preparing + distributing prescription meds to patients + other healthcare professionals
- How to become a pharmacy technician:
  - 1. Complete pharm tech certification training program
    - 146 programs in CA + most take less than year to complete
  - 2. Take PTCB exam to obtain pharm tech certification
  - 3. Obtain pharm tech license
  - 4. Update resume + interview to work at pharmacies

# **Applying to Pharmacy School**

## 1. PharmCAS

- Opens in July
- Apply the year before you plan to attend pharmacy school
  - EX: submit application Fall 2023 before attending in Fall 2024
- <u>How to apply</u>:
  - 1. Create an account
  - 2. Fill in colleges attended
  - 3. Send in official transcripts
  - 4. Manually enter coursework
  - 5. Complete experiences section
  - 6. Complete any additional sections for any school

### 2. Personal Essay

- Tell school why you want to become a pharmacist
- Recommended to start at least 6 months in advance
- Schedule appointment with advisor for fine-tuning + additional comments

### 3. Academic history

- Have to manually input all classes you've taken since high school
- Use official transcript (don't look at Oasis)

### 4. Letters of recommendation

- Most schools require 3 LORs (check requirements)
- Who can you ask?
  - A professor you made a connection with
  - Healthcare professional you worked with or shadowed
  - Supervisor from an experience outside of school
- Good LORs will come from ppl who you know well + have connection with

- Stay in touch with professors if you're not applying right away (i.e. gap year)
  - Send them emails during breaks + ask how they have been doing

# After Applying

- Should hear back from schools about whether you got an interview 1-2 months after applying
- How to prepare for interviews:
  - HPA mock interviews in fall
    - Can do mock interviews during drop-in advisings
  - Both HPA + ICC offer interview workshops
