

 - Residency = condenses 3 years of experience into one
 - #1 PharmD and MBA dual degree program
 - #1 PharmD and JD dual degree program
 - #1 MS in Healthcare Decision Analysis
- Curriculum
 - 4 Year Program
 - Personalized Path
 - Clinical experiences in your first year
 - IPPEs & APPEs
 - Pharmacy Internships
 - 14 mentors over 4 years
 - Diverse student organizations
 - Interprofessional education integrated into the program
 - Medicine, Nursing, Physical Therapy, Dentistry, Public Health, Social Work, etc
 - In your 3rd year, you'll be doing a research project
- Wide USC Network
 - Lots of alumni, 10,000+
 - Can form long lasting relationships with other students, faculty, and alumni
 - Can help with with networking and getting future jobs
 - Ex: People are getting job offers by Feb. of their last year
 - Has worldwide connections

- Admission Requirements
 - Have to have a Bachelor's Degree (Doesn't matter what topic)
 - Complete the pre-req courses
 - P/NP courses during Covid is acceptable
 - 3.0 minimum GPA and pre-req 3.0 GPA
 - 3.4 science GPA
 - 3 Letters of recommendation

- 1 Has to be from a Science Professor
- Official Transcripts
- Mandatory Interview
 - If accepted from the application
 - Will hear after a week/week in a half
- Rolling Admission
- Applying Via PharmCas

 - How does the PharmD & MBA 5 year program work?
 - Start your first year, then apply for the MBA program and then start your MBA in your second year
 - 3rd&4th year to finish the rest of the PharmD program
 - 5th year is to finish up the rest of what you need to do
 - Do the pre-pharm requirements need to be finished by the time we apply? Or is it by the time the program starts?
 - Pre-reqs have to be finished by the time that the program starts
 - What is a typical day of a student like?

 - Thursdays are case conference days
 - Case study day where students are working in groups on cases together
